Project Overview

This summer, you will create a **Scrapbook of the gods** based on *D'Aulaire's Book of Greek Myths*.

Each page will creatively highlight the gods, goddesses, heroes, monsters, and important myths you read about. Your scrapbook will combine **art**, **creative writing**, and **mythological knowledge**!

Requirements

- At least 15 pages total.
- Each page must include BOTH writing and visuals.
- Must cover the major myths and characters from the book.
- Use your own words no internet research!
 Neatness matters it should be something you're proud of.
- Creativity counts funny, clever, original ideas are encouraged.

Page Ideas

Pick from these and mix them up. You must use each option ONE time. You may repeat an option only if you have used each idea once. For example, if you use the trading cards for Zeus's Family (the Pantheon pages 16-70) or make a comic displaying Hercules' tasks, you cannot repeat those options unless you have used all the other ideas first.

Cover	Title, Illustration, Your name		
Table of Contents	Title of pages, and page numbers		
Family Tree Map	Draw a colorful Greek god family tree. You may print things to use, be your tree should look "professional."		
Trading Cards	Design "trading cards" for gods and heroes.		
Myth Comic	Create a 1–2 page comic for a myth. All parts of the plot map should be covered (exposition, rising action, climax, falling action, resolution)		
Instagram Profile	Fake social media profile for gods/heroes.		
Report Card	Create a report card with class names (5-7), grades & teacher comments		
Newspaper Article	Write myth-related news reports.		
Dear Diary	2 diary entries from gods or heroes: one from beginning to mid story, one from mid story to end of story		
Wanted Poster	For monsters or villains.		
Myth Mashup	Imagine heroes/gods swapping roles. Rewrite myth.		
Interview Transcript	Mock interviews with one of the characters. 1 page typed.		
Symbol Collage	Draw/collect 12 significant myth symbols.		
4 x 6 in Vacation Postcard	Write from a mythological place. Illustrate front. Detailed paragraph on the back with address		
Character Growth Chart	Chart a hero's development.		
Theme Tracker	Explore common themes like pride or loyalty.		
Current Symbols	Find 12 examples of mythological symbols in today's society. For example: Nike, goddess of victory, is linked to Nike sports wear.		
Final Reflection	Share your favorite lesson learned.

Sketch lightly first	So you don't have to erase like a maniac later
