Section 1: Character Analysis

Who Can You Trust?

Choose **two** characters from *Swipe* (for example: Logan, Erin, Blake, or Peck). For each character:

- Character Traits: List 3 traits and explain with examples from the story (2–3 sentences per trait).
- **Motivations:** What does this character want most? (1 paragraph 5 sentences)
- **Trust Meter:** Rate the character's trustworthiness from 1–10 and defend your rating with examples.

Section 2: Theme Connections

The Dangers of Blind Trust

Answer thoughtfully in paragraphs (5–7 sentences each):

- 1. How does technology become dangerous in Swipe? Give 2 examples.
- 2. Why do some people follow the government's rules even when they seem wrong?
- 3. Can you think of a real-world example where people trusted technology or leaders too much? (It can be from history or the news.)

Section 3: Creative Task

Build Your Survival Kit

Imagine you live in the world of Swipe and are Unmarked. Create a Survival Kit with 5 essential items:

- Draw your survival kit OR create a list with small illustrations.
- For each item, write 3–5 sentences:
 - Why is this item important?
 - o How will it help you stay safe from being tracked?

Section 4: Final Challenge

Design a New Society

Design a **new society** where people are protected from the dangers shown in *Swipe*. Create a poster, brochure, or one-page plan including:

- Name of your society
- 3 rules to protect citizens
- 1 safe communication method (describe it)
- A symbol or flag for your new society (draw it)



- Create a Wanted Poster for Logan, Erin, or another character.
 - Include a sketch, a list of "crimes," and a made-up reward!
